SYNOPSIS OF CLASSES

CHURCH LEADERSHIP DIVISION

PASTORS' AND MINISTERS' SUBDIVISION

The Pastors' and Ministers' Subdivision is designed to aid pastors in understanding their role of moving people from membership to discipleship. Pastors will listen to strategies and share in discussions with other pastors regarding ministry for the twenty-first century. The afternoon sessions open each day with a joint session of preaching by venerable NBC USA pastors of the age.

The Pastor's Alternative for Teacher Certification (PATC) is an alternative to Phase I of the Certificate of Progress Program (COPP) designed to provide an avenue for teacher certification for pastors with at least five years of pastoral experience. The student will receive a certificate for completing the PATC. The Pastor's Advanced Training Program (PATP) is an extended advanced study program intended for pastors and consists of Phases II-IV. If enrolled in this program, on completion of the phases the student will receive a Diploma of Pastoral Studies. A pastor may take these classes for general continuing education without enrolling for credit hours.

MORNING CLASSES

Church Growth: Pathway to Excellence in Small Churches (PATP)

This course will focus on understanding the dynamics of small and medium size churches and using that knowledge to grow the church. Various biblical principles and church growth strategies will be studied to build an effective and flourishing ministry. **Credit Option:** This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 9924, Congregational Leadership in the 21st Century.

The Issues Surrounding the Church and Politics (PATP)

This course will address the issues surrounding the church and politics, in general, and the African-American church. The need for the church's prophetic voice in addressing the concerns that challenge our people today will be discussed in this course. **Credit Option:** This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 9922, The History and Continuing Role of the African-American Church in America.

Pastoral Care and Counseling (PATP)

This course will provide pastors and grief ministry leaders with tools and resources to minister to people who experience life crises. **Credit Option:** This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 8058, Developing a Christian Counseling Ministry.

Pastor's Alternative for Teacher Certification (PATC)

This course is designed to provide an avenue for teacher certification for pastors with at least three to five years of pastoral experience. Admission into the program requires a letter from the church that verifies five years in the pastorate, or letters from two or more churches

AFTERNOON JOINT SESSION

Pastoral Leadership Joint Session: Engaging the Wisdom of the Elders

This session is designed to engage participants in conversation with two of our convention's venerated pastors. Topics will include: mentoring the next generation of pastors and congregational leaders and preaching and pastoring the next generation.

AFTERNOON CLASSES

Prophetic Preaching Seminar (PATP)

This seminar will focus on themes and crafting sermons that reflect a prophetic preaching tradition. **Credit Option:** This seminar will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 9908, Narrative Preaching and 9909, Fundamentals of Preaching in the African-American Church.

9902—The Spiritual Life of the Minister: Equipping the Heart, Mind and Soul for Christian Ministry (PATP)

This course will explore the dimensions of spirituality that should characterize the life of the faithful minister. Deal with his devotional life, his family relationships, and his time of study and meditation. Share with the minister those activities that will keep him in touch with God and keep him ready to serve people effectively.

9912—Seminar for Young Ministers: Equipping a New Generation of Preachers and Pastors (PATP)

This course will discuss practical matters as church administration, staff relationships, community leadership, ministerial ethics, work with congregational leadership, and review the traditional and the contemporary roles of associate and assistant ministers. **Credit Option:** This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 9911, The Role of the Associate/Assistant Minister.

CHURCH MINISTRIES SUBDIVISION

The Church Ministries Subdivision provides in-depth opportunities for training of church leaders in specific areas of ministry in the local church. Lectures and workshop modules will be used to maximize timely information and subject materials. The areas of ministry highlighted for this 40th annual conference are Christian Education, Christian Stewardship, Intergenerational Ministry, Young Adult Ministry, and Women's Ministry. These classes are both informational and inspirational.

MORNING CLASSES

Christian Education Ministry: Equipping and Engaging a New Generation

This course is designed to provide Christian educators with practical strategies/resources for mission and ministries. Various lectures and modules have been planned to complement the biblical text for our contemporary challenges as educators in the twenty-first century. Credit Option: This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 6013, Organizing the Church for Christian Education.

Young Adult Ministry: Equipping and Engaging a New Generation

What does it look like for local churches to be truly committed to reaching young adults aged 18-35 in-and-outside of their congregations? Credit Option: This course may be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 2060, Reaching and Keeping Those Under 40, or 2061, Millennials in Ministry.

2096—The Christian Education Director: Equipping New Leadership

This course will examine the role and responsibility of the Christian Education Director. Acquaint the participant with strategies on how to work with the pastor and congregation leadership in planning, evaluating, and coordinating a comprehensive Christian Education Ministry.

AFTERNOON CLASSES

Debt Free Living

This course is designed to introduce students to dfree® a transformational, lifestyle movement that promotes financial freedom through values-based principles and practical approaches to financial management. Thousands of churches, organizations, and individuals around the world have used the dfree® strategy a way toward financial freedom. Learn how to use these strategies and principles in your personal life, organization, and church. **Credit Option:** This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for 2007, Christian Stewardship.

Developing Women's Ministry Leadership

This course will look at traditional and contemporary roles of women leaders in the Christian Church and community. Participants will examine how women lead and how they can prepare the next generation of Christian women leaders. **Credit Option:** This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for 8047, Developing a Women's Ministry

Intergenerational Church Leadership: Modeling Collective Leadership Across All Generations

Drawing on the lessons of leaders and churches that have already discovered ways to work effectively with multigenerational ministry teams, this leadership training course will explore and help you implement proven, practical techniques for thriving in the five-generational



church. Join us for a highly interactive, fun, learning experience where you will discover and apply best practices for managing all the generations in today's ocean of talent that join our churches! **Credit Option:** This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for SP0010, Making Christian Education a Lifelong Experience.

CURRICULUM SUBDIVISION

This subdivision is designed to prepare and equip participants with training and practical insights into developing, organizing, and implementing curriculum-based ministries and resources.

AFTERNOON CLASS

Living the Baptist Faith

Why be and stay a Baptist? This is a critical question as many churches and individuals struggle with what it means to be Baptist in an age of rising non-denominationalism. This class is designed to help participants in knowing, understanding, and embracing their unique Baptist identity, history, doctrines, beliefs, and wonderful distinctive. The class will introduce students to a new and improved Living the Baptist Faith (formerly Baptist Training Union) training series, which includes new and exciting tools, and approaches that meet the needs of today's church. **Credit Options:** This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for Certificate of Progress Program (COPP) course 2011, Baptist Doctrine; or, Pastors' Advanced Training Program (PATP) course 9906, Baptist Beliefs and Practices.

CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP DIVISION

CERTIFICATION SUBDIVISION

This subdivision is designed to acquaint moderators, congress presidents, state directors, deans, and instructors with the policies and procedures governing Christian Leadership Schools that function under the auspices of the local church, district, state, or the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc. Courses in this section will assist students in completing the Certificate of Progress Program (COPP) and address the process and requirements for leadership school accreditation and certification/recertification of deans and instructors.

MORNING CLASSES

1104 — James

The study of the letter of James, with emphases on authorship, date, theme, and recipients will offer an excellent tool for students looking for a more practical application of their faith.

2097—Rethinking Christian Education for Contemporary Innovations

This course will examine the current trends, methodologies, and practices in Christian education to determine their validity and alliances with the Scriptures. (Requirement for Instructor Recertification)

2099A—Dean Certification (Part I)

This course will review the history of Christian education in the life of the National Baptist Convention, USA., Inc. Primary emphasis will be centered on the Certificate of Progress Program and its objectives (COPP), its founders, and its objectives. Students will also be introduced to the availability and concept of Specialization training. The course will include such vital information as enlistment and training of staff. The concept of dean of record (DOR) will be introduced. Students will become familiar with forms and procedures necessary for the management of schools, classes and student progress.

2099C—Dean Certification (Part III)

This course will review forms and administrative procedures in the planning and supervision of the Christian Leadership School. Students will be alerted to "hot spots" to be avoided by deans and presidents, in the planning and supervision of the school as it progresses. Likewise, the students will learn steps for advising and monitoring individual students, through the phases and programs of the Christian Leadership School system.

2100—Guidelines for Recertification of Deans

This course is designed for deans seeking recertification. Deans are required to be recertified every five (5) years. Students will discuss the roles and responsibilities of deans and their relationship with state directors. Contemporary issues in Christian education, trends, and methods will be addressed as a portion of this course.

7014—Equipping Laypersons to Serve

This course will emphasize the importance of the work and the ministry of the laypersons in the church and how their work will help their church to grow and be of service not only in the church but also in their community.

AFTERNOON CLASSES

1061—Survey of Haggai

This course will probe the Old Testament prophetic book written to encourage the people of Israel, who had returned to their native land after the captivity in Babylon. Students will learn that even though this is a short book, it is filled with challenges and promises, reminding us of God's claim on our lives.

2015 Foundation of Christian Ethics (Phase 4)

This course will focus on understanding the philosophical and Christological approaches to Christian ethics. Students will engage in biblical principles for decision making and conduct for living.

2099D—Dean Certification (Part IV)

This, the final phase of the course training will prepare the students for internship and the administration of their first school, and for advising and guiding individual students through CLS programs. Students will review the entire program of instruction.

7010 Introduction to Discipleship: Developing a Culture of Discipleship

This course will provide biblical principles and strategies for making disciples. Students will examine the character traits of a healthy disciple while looking at the overall examples of Jesus.

7024—Discovering Your Spiritual Gifts

This course will help students to understand who God has uniquely made them to be. Work through a spiritual gift assessment that will help them to discover their spiritual gift(s). Their discovering their spiritual gift(s) will prepare them to move into a significant area of service where they best fit into the body of Christ.

8035—The African-American Church and Social Justice

This course will investigate the lives, theology, and methods of the great servants of God who dedicated their lives in the struggle for the liberation of people. Discuss the role of the African-American church in the struggle for the liberation of people.

SPECIALIZATION EDUCATION STUDIES PROGRAM SUBDIVISION

The Specialization Education Studies Program (SESP) is an advanced study program intended for those students who have completed the four phases of the Certificate of Progress Program (COPP). It is designed for those persons desiring to focus on a selected area of Christian ministry. However, any interested delegate can register for specialization courses.

MORNING CLASSES

SP0001—Understanding the Bible

This course will provide the student with a historical overview of the origin and purpose of the Bible. Students will discover the purpose of both the Old and New Testament. NEW Credit Options: This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for COPP course 1004 Effective Bible Reading.

SP0007—Systematic Theology

This course will cover fundamental Christian beliefs as contained in the Scriptures. In this study, students will be able to think critically about the Scriptures through discussions of broader themes such as theology, eschatology, anthropology, and soteriology.

AFTERNOON CLASSES

SP0015—Church Administration

This course will reflect upon the purpose and objectives of the church administrator, and then lead the students in developing an administrative plan for the church in cooperation with the pastor. It will include an introduction to human resources, finance management, administrative and supervisory responsibilities.

SP0020—Leadership Strategies

This course seeks to bring the students to a definite awareness of the church's purpose by reexamining the church's goals, priorities, and organizational strategies. Students will examine various leadership practices, models, and concepts in search of more effective leadership outcomes.

SP0023—Developing the Church for Christian Evangelism

This course is designed to awaken the gift of evangelism in the local church. It takes into consideration the various personalities in the church and seeks to develop these personalities based on their gifts, talents, and understanding of biblical teachings.

DEAN CERTIFICATION FAST-TRACK

MORNING/AFTERNOON INTENSIVE

Principles and Procedures for Deans of Christian Education

The Division of Christian Education Accreditation and Credentials (DCEAC) recognizes changing trends in education. The Dean's Fast-Track Option is designed for those persons who have completed the COPP program and aspire to pursue dean certification at an accelerated pace.

Requirements and Registration for Fast-Track

Requirements for those who wish to register for the Dean Fast-Track (2099A-D) are as follows:

- You must have received the Certificate of Progress Program Diploma (COPP) or a Diploma of Pastoral Studies (PATP) or have
 met the alternative requirements by submitting a transcript for evaluation from a bible college or seminary to DCEAC. Either the
 diploma or the transcript evaluation acknowledgment from DCEAC must accompany the fast-track registration form.
- A Student Recommendation Form must be completed and signed by your certified (mentoring) Dean and accompany the fast-track registration form.
- You must purchase the CLS Manual (your resource for pre-work) and a subscription to the Informer. They both can be purchased on our website.

Participants will need to register for the fast-track option between June 1, 2018, and September 30, 2018. Registrations for fast-track will not be accepted if postdated after September 30, 2018.

If all requirements are met, the registered student will receive class assignments from the instructor by October 10, 2018. The assignments will be emailed to the student. The student is to complete all pre-work assignments before the Conference. The student must complete all inclass assignments and testing during the Conference. The student will still need to complete the mentoring requirements and any required writing.

The Fast-Track registration form can be downloaded from the SSPB Conference registration site along with a copy of the recommendation form. The registration for Fast-Track can be **mailed in, emailed or faxed and must include the fees and all documentation requirements.**

Building Strong and Healthy Family Ministries Seminar

This three-day seminar offers ministry leaders and persons searching for ways to launch, develop, strengthen, and increase the percentage of strong families and related ministries and initiatives in their church and community. These sessions will provide practical tools, proven biblical principles, and current resources that will aid them in implementing resilient and vibrant family ministries.

Credit Option: This seminar will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 8037, Administering the Family Ministry Program.

Deacons' Ministry Seminar

The Deacon's Ministry Seminar is designed to provide those persons who have been selected to serve as a deacon or who are currently serving as a deacon with training to be effective servants of the Christian church. Participants will explore the concept of Christian spirituality, discuss the process of the spiritual life, and develop a plan for their spiritual life. Participants will explore the role and responsibility of the church deacon as an extension of the pastoral ministry. Attention will focus on biblical texts that support and influence the ministry of the church deacon.

Credit Option: This seminar will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 5012, How to Become an Effective Deacon. **Facilitator:** Dr. Walter Solomon Sr., Anniston, AL

Organizing and Maintaining Successful Welcoming Ministries Seminar

This three-day seminar is designed for persons responsible for facilitating, coordinating, and/or directing their congregation's welcome ministries, which include ushers, parking-lot attendants, greeters, and new member orientation. These sessions will provide participants a comprehensive plan and easy-to-use tools with which to create a climate and culture of hospitality and to develop and maintain processes of follow-up, invitation, and intentional connection with guests and newcomers.

Credit Option: This seminar will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 8017, The Ministry of Church Ushering.

Trustees' Ministry Seminar

This three-day seminar will provide persons who have been selected to serve as trustees or who are currently serving as trustees an overview of their function as stewards of the property God has entrusted to their congregation. These sessions will offer numerous practical tips and tools and will review current resources that will assist trustees in wisely supervising and maintaining both the physical property and gifts made to the congregation–so that the ministries can be effective, and all legal requirements related to the property are satisfied.

Credit Option: This seminar will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 6003, The Work of the Church Trustee.

Sunday School Superintendents' Seminars

This is a three-year cohort seminar that grants a certificate of completion for each level. Persons completing the three-year program will be recognized in the graduation ceremony.

Essentials of Leadership: Levels One and Two

The Sunday School Superintendents' Seminars are designed to provide superintendents with practical training experiences that will strengthen their leadership skills, assist in selecting and developing Sunday Church School teachers, and expose them to SSPB curricula and other Christian education resources that aid them in building a vibrant and growing Sunday Church School.




